

Epic Schools was established on 1st September 1986 as Epic Children Centre. It evolved into a fully established nursery and primary school two years later, in 1988. The secondary arm, Epic Model College, commenced operations in September 1995.

In 2013, the school became a Cambridge Associate School, fully accredited to offer Cambridge examinations from Primary to Advanced Level.

The international branch, Epic International School, Lomé (Togo), was established in September 2009, further expanding the institution into an international group of schools fully equipped with modern facilities in Science, ICT, and other academic fields to meet global standards


COMMUNITY SERVICE

AN ESSAY ON EPICAN'S NEW ICT SYSTEM



Epic School recently **UPGRADED** a new Information and Communication Technology (ICT) system, marking an important step toward preparing students for a digital future. This modern platform replaces several old and disconnected tools by bringing learning, communication, and administrative functions together in one cloud-based system. This essay explains why the school upgraded its ICT system, describes its main parts, discusses its impact on teaching and learning, highlights some challenges faced, and looks at how the system can improve in the future.

The decision to adopt a new ICT system came from several challenges the school was facing. First, the old system often had bandwidth issues and frequent downtime, which interrupted lessons and made work stressful for teachers and students. Second, as blended and remote learning became more important, the school needed a system that supported video conferencing, real-time collaboration, and easy access to digital materials from any device. Lastly, the school needed one unified system to simplify tasks like attendance, grading, and report generation so that teachers could focus more on teaching.

The new ICT system has three main modules:

Learning Management Module (LMM):

This is the main area for teaching and learning. Teachers can upload lesson notes, videos, and quizzes, while students can submit assignments, view their results, and join discussion forums. It works smoothly on laptops, tablets, and smartphones.

Communication Module:

This module allows secure messaging, announcements, and a shared calendar that connects teachers and parents. It helps maintain clear and timely communication across the school.

Administrative Module:

This part of the system handles attendance, timetable creation, and report card generation automatically. It collects information from the LMM, reducing mistakes and saving time.

Since the new ICT system was **upgraded**, it has brought positive changes to the school. Teachers have noticed that students participate more actively because interactive quizzes give instant feedback. This has improved engagement and made it easier for teachers to provide tailored instruction based on students' needs.

Conclusion

In conclusion, Epican's new ICT system has greatly improved how the school teaches, communicates, and manages its daily activities. Although there were challenges during the transition, the system has already shown its value by increasing efficiency and enhancing learning.
